Class News

Reception:

Another busy two weeks for Reception. Reception really enjoyed their first trip to Forest School last Friday, we spent our time talking through the safety of being at the forest and creating our own dens. The children even created their own pirate plank to walk across. It was lovely to see them in the outdoors and transferring the skills they have learnt from the classroom outside. Da iawn Reception for your amazing teamwork! In our Science over the past two weeks, we have made sensible predictions about what materials will be best to make a sail out of, we then created their sails. We tested each material and observed which boat went the furthest and the shortest distance. The children used some lovely descriptive language. In Numeracy we have been focusing on sorting a range of different real-life objects. We talked about there being lots of different ways we can sort; size, shape, pattern, colour, etc. The children are continuing to learn a new sound a day and I can see the progression they have made from practising at home too, so, a big thank you for all your support! We have also started to look at what makes a healthy diet. The children have really enjoyed creating a healthy lunch box for Pirate Pete. Thank you again for all your support over this half term!

Year One:

This fortnight, Year 1 have made predictions, observations and evaluations for a science experiment, testing which material works best as a ship's sail. They provided excellent explanations as to why each material would or would not work well, and worked successfully as teams to test and record results for each ship. In maths, we have been finding number bonds to 10 and halving shapes. Children have also been consolidating their knowledge on healthy and unhealthy foods, discussing what makes something healthy. The Year 1 puppet shows are coming together, with the class creating their own puppets using felt and designing backdrops and scenery. A big well done to the whole class for receiving pupil of the week as a cohort. I have been so impressed with how well they have listened and respected lots of different members of staff over the past two weeks. Da iawn Year 1!

Year Two:

Year two have had a busy two-weeks taking full adventure of the beautiful weather, spending a lot of time in the outdoors. In forest school, we created collages of creature from leaves, twigs and natural resources. In our PE lesson we have continue to showcase our pirate movements to put together our dance sequence, the children have shown great independence and collaboration. In our Numeracy this week the children have looked at greater than and less than, we learnt a song to help us remember which way the symbol needs to go and the children have shown great progression with their understanding. In Literacy we have created words bank in preparation for our poem writing this week. The children have very impressed me with their use of vocabulary, da iawn Year 2! As part of our Science, we have started to look at a healthy plate and what type of foods we need to have a balanced diet. We are encouraging the children that no food is unhealthy, we just need to eat certain foods in moderation. On Friday we showed our support for give racism the red card! Thank you for your continued support over this half term.

Year Three:

This week the children have worked really hard to paint their own seascapes inspired by famous artists. We have created our painting in 'layers' to show the background and foreground, and considered how we could use different media for different effects. In Literacy some of us received a mysterious letter challenging us to use our investigative and inference skills to find out who a range of washed-up items belonged to. We have also continued our work on our Autumn poetry, using ICT to present our fantastic descriptive writing. Our Maths has seen us working on column subtraction to take away 3-digit numbers – we've done lots of practice to ensure we all remember the golden rules, ask your child what they are! We have been exploring how to use our bodies in different ways to respond to stormy music in P.E, and have started to learn about the musical elements to appraise different pieces of classical music.

Year Four:

Another busy two weeks! The children have completed some really interesting seascapes. Some of them have been inspired by famous artists such as Monet, Turner, Van Gogh, Hokusai and others have just created their own. The children are now in the process of making and decorating some frames to display their creations. Hopefully we can have a little Art Gallery. In Numeracy we have been multiplying and dividing by 10; lots of authentic activities to embed their knowledge, such as planning for a party and costing items with a budget. In Literacy, we received a letter from Mr and Mrs Binns who asked us to determine who we thought specific items belonged to, as they were found washed up on a beach. There was lots of excitement, conversations and reasoning skills taking place. Hopefully Mr and Mrs Bins will come into school to read our detailed descriptions of the items. This week we are creating charcoal pictures of one of the people that was found on the camera film when it was developed. (From the book Flotsam). The children have loved learning all about sea shanties and singing The Wellerman, and last week they created their own Shanty. In our Welsh sessions we are using past tense language to plan a diary entry from the point of view of crew on board a ship, thinking about what we see, hear etc. Thank you for your support.

Year Five:

Another busy fortnight in Year 5 with a great start with our Hello Yellow day which saw the children come into school dress in yellow and participate in mindfulness activities throughout the day. We have continued to immerse ourselves into the topic of Take One Picture and reading our novel The Tempest. Using our Pupil Voice ideas, we have created a news report focusing on the headline, Lost at Sea and brochures advertising the Island with No Name as a fantastic holiday destination. We took part in our first live Barclays Coding session where we learnt how to programme code to create different types of shapes, which was lots of fun working with a partner to change the size of the shape using different coding commands. For maths we had a go at some authentic learning where we planned a menu for a journey on a ship and worked out how much it would cost to last a journey of different lengths. We also welcomed Georgina from Melin homes who came to speak to us about her job and her other role as the local councillor for the town where she lives and what that entails. We enjoyed trying to spend the £500 pounds she gave us and deciding which project was the worthiest of the money. This week we have started planning our science, investigating the statement the longer the boat the faster/further it will travel. As you can see, we have had another busy couple of weeks in Year 5 and thank you to those parents who were able to come and see our learning during the book sharing session.

Year Six:

Over the last two weeks Year 6 we have continued with our topic of Take One Picture and our novel of The Tempest. Using google slides, the children have created leaflets either advertising the Island with no name where Prospero lives or government warnings against travelling to the island. They were incredibly persuasive in both respects. We have also written and recorded news broadcasts about the sinking of the ship in The Tempest which has helped to enhance both our oracy and digital skills. We had a wonderful live lesson with Barclays coding, learning how to use a VR platform and create shapes. The shapes they created were amazing, with lots of collaboration and teamwork supporting each other. Our maths has been focussed on authentic learning by creating and costing menu's for sailors at sea for the cheapest amount possible. For science and technology, we have been working collaboratively with year 5 to investigate the question "Does the length of the boat affect the speed/distance it travels?". The children are all looking forward to seeing how their boats travel and whether their predictions were correct or not. We were lucky to have a visit from Melin homes who worked with us for the morning, helping us to hone our skills of co-operation and understanding a little more about democracy. Health and Wellbeing has seen us start learning how to play hockey. Year 6 amazed me by how quickly they progressed in just one lesson! Thank you to all of you who came to share the children's book with them this week, it was lovely to see them proudly explaining their work.


