Class News

Reception:

Welcome back Reception, I hope you all had a lovely half term. The children have been super excited to tell me about all their adventures they had over the past week. It is great to see you all back. This week we have introduced our new topic for the half term, 'magic and mystery'. The children have discussed their ideas and provided some lovely routines for the learning to go down. We have also begun preparations for our Foundation Phase Nativity, this is the first for Reception and we are all so excited to share this with you. You should all have received a letter stating what part your child will be within the performance. The children decided upon these costumes themselves and are extremely excited to begin practising. As a Foundation Phase we have started to learn the songs from the Nativity, this year we will be performing "Little Angel Gets Her Wings". This week we have been celebrating Remembrance Day and learning about why we donate money to wear a poppy. The children have created their own poppies through their expressive arts and used the iPads to create their own Flanders Poppy Field pictures. In Maths we have been focusing on 3D shapes within their environment and learning how to spot these in our everyday life. Reception have been trying tremendously hard with their reading and have loved to share this with Miss Ward and 1. This week our classroom bear goes on his first adventure to listen to someone read over the weekend. We can't wait to hear all about the adventures on Monday! What a great start to the half term for Reception!

Year One:

Welcome back Year 1! It has been lovely to welcome back the children to an exciting half term at Trellech. We have already begun preparations for our Foundation Phase nativity which we cannot wait to have you in school for to watch this year! I will be sending out information regarding parts and costumes as well as lines and songs to learn very soon. The nativity is called Little Angel Gets Her Wings, and Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 joined together on Tuesday to listen to some of the songs they will be learning. Year 1 enjoyed a very wet Forest School this week – creating magic wands out of sticks to begin our topic of Magic and Mystery. They certainly took the weather in their stride so well done to them all! In maths we have begun to explore a hundred square, using this to count bigger numbers, find one more and one less, count in 10s and work out a hidden number. For Remembrance Day on Friday the children will be writing a shape poem, exploring how we can write a poem in the shape of a poppy. In Welsh we have been learning colours alongside singing 'Aderyn Melyn' ('Yellow Bird') for Wales' World Cup Singalong on Thursday. A busy and exciting start to the half term for Year 1!

Year Two:

Welcome back for another very busy half term in Year 3. This week we have been doubling two - digit numbers and grouping objects into equal amounts in readiness for work on multiplication. We have also been learning how to ask if somebody has a brother or sister in Welsh. Christmas is around the corner so we have started to learn songs for our Foundation Phase nativity.

Year Three:

Just before half term, Year 3 were visited by the Welsh Ambulance Service to learn some important life-saving skills. We learnt how to put somebody in the recovery position and perform CPR, and found out how important it is to know our address and postcode in case of an emergency. The children collaborated brilliantly in groups to design and build a boat out of junk materials – hopefully they will survive our test on a 'stormy sea'! In Literacy we are looking forward to reading our new book The Varmints linked to our **Heal the World** topic. In Numeracy we have been working on learning our 3- and 4-times tables, playing lots of games to practice. We also collected natural materials outside to represent our tables by putting the items into groups of the right amount. Next week we will start to look at telling the time and reading analogue clocks. This week at Forest School we loved making toffee apples over the campfire, and enjoyed having time to explore.

Year Four:


Welcome back to a very busy, albeit exciting term. During the last week of half term we were lucky enough to have Welsh Ambulance Service to visit the school. We were shown how to put a patient into recovery position, perform CPR and use a defibrillator. We also learned the importance of knowing our full address, including the postcode. We completed our paintings in the style of a Seascape, together with decorating a frame, and they are now beautifully displayed in our classroom. The children have nearly finished their boats using junk materials and this week we are testing them to see if they will withstand a storm! Mr Binns visited the school to find out who the flotsam and jetsam belonged to. He was really impressed with the detailed descriptions of the belongings that were washed up on the beach. In Literacy we wrote detailed descriptions of some of the illustrations from the book- Flotsam. We now look forward to studying our new book this term called The Varmints. This will fit nicely with our new topic- **Heal the World**. In Numeracy we used various leaves from around the school to calculate their surface area. We then created pictograms and worked out which leaves were the most common in the grounds of the school. We were all quite surprised by how many different trees we have around the school. We were so impressed with the children's creations using leaves from around the school- crowns, wreaths and hanging decorations. This has given us food for thought for our enterprise week. We will continue with outdoor P.E as much as possible on a Friday afternoon, so please ensure your child has warm/waterproof clothing. We are very excited about the forthcoming Football World Cup and of course showing our support for Wales! Thank you for your support.

Year Five:

Another busy start to the term in Year 5, with the finishing of our Take One Picture topic and the starting of our new topic, Power, Politics and Protests. The children enjoyed completing the Take One Picture topic especially our final week which saw the use of pupil voice to decide on their own learning. Challenge week, as we called it saw the children completing activities and ideas they had previously selected in their pupil voice which we hadn't had time to complete through the topic. Activities ranged from creating a stormy sea dance to making an emotions chart using the weather. All children had the opportunity to complete as many of the activities as they wished either independently, in small groups or in pairs. It was great to see the range of independently learning happening in the classroom. We were also lucky to be given the opportunity to learn two new dances; the first dance, delivered by Georgina from Melin Homes linked closely with our topic, using the music from Pirates of the Caribbean. The second dance, hosted by Ros Escott from Drama Queens helped us get in the mood for Halloween using the music from Thriller. We definitely have some budding performers in Year 5. This week we have been thinking about Remembrance Day and why we wear the poppy, we then sketched our own poppy and made them out of recycled material. Year 5 participated with the rest of the school in the Wales' World Cup Sing-a-long, which saw over 230,000 school children from across Wales sing together to celebrate the start of the Football World Cup. We also participated in our second coding lesson from Barclay's Live Coding using Scratch to programme a shark to chase Nemo – we all enjoyed it but we relived he could catch him. A great, and busy start to our new term – da iawn Year 5.

Year Six:

This newsletter sees the culmination of our topic "Take One Picture" and the beginning of our new topic "Power, Politics and Protest". The week before half term the children engaged in Challenge Week where we gave them two tasks for each Area of Learning and Experience, based completely on pupil voice. These ranged from learning to play the theme tune to Pirates of the Caribbean on the xylophone, creating a graphic novel of The Tempest and creating a piece of outdoor art using natural materials. The results were outstanding, and it was lovely to see the children guiding their own learning. We were lucky enough to be taught two dances, firstly by Ros Escott who taught us a dance to Thriller and also by Georgina from Melin homes who taught us a dance to the theme tune from Pirates of the Caribbean. Numeracy has seen us learning how to multiply using the grid method and making videos to help explain the method to other children. Our new topic consists of learning more about black history, segregation and the role of the Chartists in our history. For literacy we studied and made biographies about three notable black women (Dorothy Vaughan, Mary Jackson and Katherine Johnson) who will feature heavily in our literacy in the coming weeks. We were lucky enough to participate in another live coding lesson from Barclays this week, creating a shark game using repetition which all the children excelled in. We raised our voices in Wales's World Cup Singalong organised by the Urdd, joining 230,000 other children to show our support for the Welsh players heading to the Fifa World Cup 2022. Finally, to end our week we took the time to remember the service and sacrifice of all those who have defended our freedom.

Worrying about money?

You are not alone. Money worries are more common than most of us realise. It might be an unexpected drop in income, bills starting to pile up, or finding it harder to cover the basics - these issues can affect anyone.

- Checking to see if you're entitled to more money in benefits or small grants.
- Help with reducing essential costs and connecting with local support.
- Advice on managing debts and ways to reduce your repayments.
- Help getting back into work or into more secure employment.
- Support to help you stay in your home.

If you are struggling it is always better to seek help and advice sooner rather than later - but it is also never too late to ask for help. You may be surprised at how much can be done to help you get back on your feet.

We have a short guide to help you see the types of help and support that are available, with details of national organisations as well as local links and connections. Help may be available in places you might not expect.
