Class News

Reception: Over the past two weeks Reception have been getting to grips with their topic of 'the world around me'. We have been focusing on the new life that is happening around us. For example, we were very lucky to have a visit from Mr Jane to discuss the importance of looking after tadpoles. We have been looking at the life cycle of a frog and a have started to learn a song to remember the order of the life cycle. In Numeracy we have been halving objects and amounts as well as adding one or two more to a given number. In literacy and health and wellbeing, we have been working on expanding our answers to questions and talking about why we are feeling certain ways by using the phase 'tell me more'. We have been looking at the world around us in forest school by explore what objects we can find and how we would label them, again strengthening our descriptive language. We are really excited to welcome parents back into school on Friday 31st at 2:00pm to take part in our Easter bonnet session. If you would like to bring any additional resources with you to decorate your Easter bonnets, please do so. However, there will be some resources available. Thank you for your continued support!



<u>Year One</u>: This fortnight year 1 have been very excited by the arrival of some tadpoles to the school. We have been learning all about the life cycle of a frog and discovered some very long words like metamorphosis! The children have even created edible life cycles using a variety of fruits. We have been focussing on diary entries writing in first person and past tense. In maths we have been subtracting by finding the difference between two numbers. In Welsh we have labelled the clothes we would wear on a holiday to a sunny or cold country.



Year Two: Year Twos have enjoyed estimating and measuring capacities as well as designing and creating their own drinks for a coronation party. They thought carefully about the size of drinks vessels needed and were able to find the total amount of millilitres when adding the different liquids. In literacy we have continued the theme of authentic learning by writing up a set of instructions based on our Welsh cakes making session. The pupils used interesting time openers and imperative verbs for this alongside some cleverly thought -out tips. The pupils enjoyed creating their Mother's Day cards and their dreamcatchers whilst at Forest Schools. We have been learning about the water cycle in science and labelling maps of Wales using atlases during humanities.

¥ear Three:

Over the last 2 weeks in Year 3, we have been focussing on instructions – identifying key features, exploring the importance of making our instructions clear and concise, and practising using verbs and adverbs, before writing our own instructions for making traditional Welsh Cakes (of course we had to make and sample these first so we knew what we were talking about!) We went on to apply this to our ICT work, writing algorithms to program a robot. This was quite tricky, and we had to do lots of debugging to correct our errors, but we really enjoyed being computer programmers. In Maths we have continued our work on division, using the method of taking away 'chunks' at a time. We have been finding out about photosynthesis, and discussing why plants are so vital to our environment because of the oxygen they produce. The children carried out an investigation so that they could see the plants giving off oxygen, and used their scientific writing skills to explain what was happening. We have been working hard to learn our pieces on the Doods, and are looking forward to welcoming you to our performance next week!

Year Four:

We had a great time at Forest School last week. It was cold, wet and really muddy. What child doesn't like mud!! The children created interesting obstacle courses, really impressive limbo, carrying and throwing logs, jumping, running ladders made from branches, army crawling, javelin; to name but a few. Great teamwork and communication. In Literacy last week we have been focussing on using paragraphs correctly and writing diary entries using some of the skills we have learnt. We have created e-brochures about Trellech and learnt how to create QR codes. This week in Literacy we have been focusing on instructions; identifying the language and text features of this particular genre. This will then support the children to write up their Science investigations. Science Week kicked off with an eruption of CO2!! The children made predictions about what might happen when mentos were added to different carbonated drinks. We recorded the height of the eruption and discussed the trajectory of each drink. The children then concluded what happened. We have continued with Science this week- looking at the structure of the lungs and how our respiratory system works. In Numeracy we have been looking at the relationship between grams and kilograms and how to read a variety of scales as well as convert between the units. Well done to the children who represented our class/school at the Cluster Eisteddfod this week too- we were very proud of you. Thank you for your continued support.





¥ear 5

What another busy couple of weeks Year 5 have had. We started the week with a science focus, very excitedly we were going to be using a real parachute. Unfortunately not the type you use when jumping out of a plane, the RA would have been too tricky, but the type athletes use when training and using air resistance. Year 5 had a great time planning the investigation and then running with the parachute to prove the statement you run faster without a parachute. We then ended the week by making fizzy pop eruptions using carbonated drinks and Mentos! We made sensible predictions for which drink would have the longest eruption and then recorded our results. Next week we will be looking at lung capacity which should be lots of fun. Our literacy focus this week has been writing our instructions using imperative verbs (bossy). We used the Marvin and Milo investigations and enjoyed trying to use our own instructions to carry out the investigation, we soon realised we needed to make our writing very clear. Have a go at the instruction writing set on the homework this week using a different Marvin and Milo investigation. At the end of last week we celebrated Comic Relief, Red Nose Day by dressing in red and then running as many laps as we could around the daily mile track, this certainly kept us fit. This Wednesday we made our way to Forest School, the weather was a little different than our previous snowy visit. In the forest we used natural materials to make symmetrical pictures, with some really fantastic designs being shown. Please have a look at twitter to see some of our designs. Year Six:

The past two weeks have seen the beginning of a science focus in all of Progression Step 3. Year 6 began their journey into science by understanding the respiratory system, learning about and labelling the parts of the lungs and designing an experiment to determine whether boys or girls had a bigger lung capacity. Lots of fun was had whilst we tested the theory and analysed our results. To help with this, our maths focus has been learning about averages, such as mean and median and why we need to use these. We then moved on to symmetry and the history behind the symmetry used in Welsh blankets. The children all created their own symmetrical Welsh blanket designs and then made natural versions whilst at Forest School – the results were wonderful! Last week in literacy we looked at how and why we need paragraphs and wrote diary entries with paragraphs being the main focus. This week we have concentrated on instructions and being able to write a set of scientific instructions that are specific enough for someone to conduct an experiment with. Red Nose Day was a wonderful day with the children giving 100% to laps they ran around the daily mile track. This week we are looking at forces and air resistance, identifying the forces acting on objects and testing the resistance a parachute provides. Congratulations to the Year 6 who took part in our cluster Eisteddfod and represented the school, we were very proud of you.
