Class News

Reception:

What a lovely first week back we have had in Reception. The weather has been lovely which has allowed us to spend lots of times outdoors and in our lovely environment. We have been practicing sports day in preparation for next week. We can't wait to see you all and share our successes. In Literacy this week we have been looking at sentence openers and using them to help us to write a recount. In Numeracy, we have been counting in 2s. As our new topic has started 'healthy, confident me' we are going to go through the rest of this term learning about how we can have a healthy body and healthy mind. We've started this week by looking at what keeps use healthy and why it is important to keep clean. The children have learnt about microbes, and we even planned our own journey based on the book 'Do not lick this book'. We have welcomed the chickens back into school and we are super excited to watch as they grow. A big thank you to all the parents who made it possible over the half term for them to come back into school. Thank you for your continued support!

Year One:

This week Year 1 have been busy practising for sports day in the lovely sunshine. They have been finding half of odd numbers in maths and finishing off their fictional stories in literacy. We have enjoyed learning German with Felix and Franzi and thinking about our new topic, Confident, Healthy Me. What a great start to the final term in year 1!

Year Two:

Pupils in Year Two have been enjoying measuring the outside area to create a bird's eye view plan. They have measured in cm and m. We have also started to answer questions based on reasoning. This is all about applying mathematical knowledge to solving written problems. We have been retelling a story using similes, time openers, question openers and adverbs. The pupils have been really improving with their Welsh language skills by taking part in 'Y Gadair boeth' (the hot seat) whereby they are asked up to 18 different questions by their peers and answer them. Pupils have also been comparing and contrasting the capital cities Cardiff and Paris in humanities. They have found out lots of facts.

Year Three

It is hard to believe we are already in the final half term of Year 3! Over the last couple of weeks, we have continued our work on the Tour de France, and the children have really enjoyed finding out more about it. We carried out independent research and used the information we found to create a non-chronological report. This week in Literacy we have used our Clever Writer skills to begin planning a story involving a magic bicycle, and we look forward to writing this next week. Our Maths work has been focussed on money – we started by identifying the different coins and notes that we have, and have practised using different combinations of coins to make amounts. Then we moved on to adding together more than one amount to calculate a total, and had a go at converting between pounds and pence. In French we have been learning some names of body parts by singing Alouette which we are really enjoying! We have also been busy practising for Sports Day, and look forward to you joining us next week (fingers crossed this lovely weather sticks around!)

Year 4: Well, we can't quite believe we are now in our last half term. How time flies. This term we are studying the Artist; Picasso and the children are really enjoying creating pictures in the style of this Artist. We intend to create a little Art Gallery and invite you in to see the children's creations. This week we have been journalists, writing a Newspaper Report about a sporting event. We have been busy practising for Sports Day so, hopefully the weather will stay fine for us. Forest School will commence again next Tuesday 13th. In Numeracy we have been practising the 6x table in and out of order. Also finding the area of various shapes. We then moved on to finding the perimeter of irregular and regular shapes. In Science we have been finding out how to calculate our pulse rate and factors that can influence heart rate. They should have brought home their lines to learn now for our French performance (details to follow soon). It was good to meet with most of you to discuss your child's progress this week and we hope you enjoyed looking at their books too. Thank you for your continued support.

Year Five: Over the last two weeks we have continued to work on our summer term topic Champions, looking at different Welsh champions and writing a biography about the life. We selected a range of people we feel they are champions in their own fields from Sir Tom Jones in music, Laura Ashley in design and Tanni Grey-Thompson in sport. We then created our own newspaper reports relating to a significant event in the life of our chosen champion it share with others what they have achieved. In maths we have been learning to tell the time using the 24 hour clock, learning the difference between morning, evening and night. We have then used this new skill to read bus and train timetable to work out how long journeys might take and when we might arrive at a new destination. In Expressive Arts we have begun to learn about the famous artist Claude Monet and look at his life before he became a famous painter, we are looking forward to painting in the style of Monet in the coming week. We were very lucky on Wednesday to be invited to the Y5 Playmakers Conference run by Monlife. We had the chance to experience a range of different activities from completing a mini park run, playing a game of soft bowls and enjoying yoga in the sunshine. In PE we have been practicing for our sports day next week and look forward to welcoming you, weather permitting next Wednesday afternoon.

YearSix: The end of the summer term is fast approaching and with it lots of new learning and exciting things are happening for our Year 6 children. We have begun learning lines for our Summer performance of "Ali Baba and the Bongo Bandits" and hope you will be able to come and watch our performances. Our maths has taken us into studying functions machines and algebra, learning that letters and symbols can replace numbers. They then used this knowledge to solve algebraic equations - this has quickly become a favourite topic for the whole class! We also have been investigating how to make a year 6 super athlete by testing and timing for dexterity, agility, hand/eye coordination, speed and strength. Our topic of Champions has been weaving through our literacy. All children have picked a Welsh champion, researched their life and written a biography detailing their childhood, career, achievements and influences. This week they have used that knowledge to write a newspaper report on an event in their champions life. For science and technology we have been investigating the effect of regular exercise on the time it takes our heart rate to recover, analysing the results and graphing the data using line graphs and bar charts. Year 6 have also learned how to create formulas to use in a spreadsheet using cell references and identify that changing inputs will change the output of the calculation. Forest school has been the focus for expressive arts, where the children made their own instruments from natural resources and used them to create rhythms. We have been busy practising for sports day next week - weather permitting! - and look forward to seeing you all there. Many thanks for your continued support.
