




rellech Primary Schoo

The school day begins at 8.50am where staff are on duty to welcome all learners into school. All children should arrive in school between this time and 9am. After this time the staff close the gates and return to class. All pupils then begin their day with a variety of learning and well being activities. This is a crucial part of the day where children settle into the school day and know what the day ahead has in store. Children arriving after this time can sometimes feel 'out of the loop' as important communication has been shared. We appreciate that sometimes children are late due to a medical appointment or emergency beyond their control, but those pupils regularly arriving late often take longer to settle into the day. Thank you for your support in starting our school day punctually in advance. Likewise we ask at the end of the day children are collected punctually, thank you for informing us if you are going to be late due to unforeseen circumstances. Children will be brought to the main school reception area, so staff can then dismiss bus children safely.

Dosbarth Reception

Reception have been so busy during their first few weeks of school. Miss Light, Mrs Hassall and Miss Ward are so proud of how well you are all starting to settle in. Thank you again, to all the parents who joined us for our open morning and afternoon to see our classroom. We're looking forward to welcoming you into school more over the upcoming year.

In Maths, Reception have been focusing on recognising, ordering and forming numbers from 0-5, as well as counting out a certain number of objects and making / continuing patterns.

Reception have also been discussing the importance of understanding different emotions. They have thought carefully about when they might feel a certain way and why? Along with how we can overcome the trickier emotions that we sometimes feel.

We have started focusing on using our Welsh when answering the register, greeting others, and discussing what the weather is like each day for our Welsh weather chart. We also enjoyed our first trip to forest school through the Wet meadow and exploring a whole new environment.

We are so excited for what our year together will bring. Have a lovely weekend all!

Dosbarth 1

Dosbarth 1 have had an amazing start to the Autumn term. We have been very busy starting our new topic My School, My World, learning all about our school, who teaches in our school and the other classes — we're starting to paint pictures of the different people who help us during our school day. We have been revisiting learning to read and write our numbers to 20 and match the correct number of objects to the number and some of us have now begun to work on higher numbers. During RWInc we have been in our new groups learning to read and spell words with different sounds and we have also started our I'm a Clever Writer retelling the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears using the time openers First, Next, Then, Finally. In Welsh we have been learning to ask and respond to simple questions including our name, how we are feeling, and where we live. Mrs Cornish and Mrs Marsh have started gardening and we have been very proud to be able to share some of our harvest with you on a Thursday, we will continue sharing our produce when we can and will use any donations to help buy resources for our gardening area. On Thursday we had our first Year 1 visit to Forest School where we were joined by Reception and had fun exploring the forest and helping the Reception children.

Dosbarth 2

Croeso I Blwyddyn dau! Welcome to year 2!

We have had a very busy start to the year and pupils have been getting used to new expectations and routines. They have been learning about different sentence types in literacy in preparation for their clever writing sessions and have been taking part in Read Write Inc speed sound lessons. Pupils have been carrying out basic maths such as number bonds, place value and the use of a number square as well as creating fact families. In Welsh we have carried out a baseline assessment and we have started to learn basic language patterns. The pupils are enjoying the range of activities in our outdoor area and have been working alongside Mrs Cornish and Mrs Marsh to dig and plant. They had a wonderful time on their scavenger hunt during our Forest School session, including collecting types of seeds such as cones and acorns. We have also had a visit from Nurse Claire who told us about the work she does and shared the medical equipment with us. There was lots of interesting information and some great questioning from the pupils. Year two to complete a nature scavenger hunt. It was great to be able to explore the forest and we look forward to looking out for all the differences we notice in the environment as the seasons change.



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Dosbarth 3

We have had a brilliant start to the new term in Year three. The children have settled really well and are getting used to new expectations and routines.

In Literacy, we have been recapping work on writing instructions. We identified key features and practised using time openers to put our instructions in the correct order, and also thought about why adverbs are useful. We linked this to our digital learning, finding about algorithms before writing our own and testing them with a friend. We then had to 'debug' our algorithm if the end result wasn't what we hoped for . We have been learning to recognise and name colours in French, and have worked in pairs to ask and answer basic questions to see how much Welsh we have remembered over the holidays. Our Maths learning over the last few weeks has focused on place value — we have been working with numbers up to 1000 and are becoming confident representing and partitioning these in different ways. We have also carried out baseline assessments in Big Maths, as well as practising our times table facts and number bonds for quick recall. As part of our topic 'I am the One and Only' the children have been finding out more about their family (many thanks to you for your help with this at home!) and have started to use our technology skills to create our family tree digitally. We created an 'all about me' silhouette filled with things that represent us, and have enjoyed sharing with each other to find out about our different interests and what makes us unique. Last week we had a fantastic time at Forest School, where the children collaborated with others in.

Dosbarth 4

Our topic this term is- Memory Box. We will be focusing on our immediate environment- looking at Trellech in the Bronze age and how things have changed over time. Local historian and Archaeologist, Katie Churchill came in to talk to the children about Trellech and how archaeologists have been able to piece together evidence of how Trellech looked in the past. Katie brought lots of interesting objects and bones for the children to examine. The children were so enthused, with so many questions, which was just great. Just so fascinating! The children were then able to have a go at digging, sieving and washing bits of pottery that they excavated with katie Churchill.

A local Author, Margaret Iggulden is coming in to talk to the children on 25th September about her recent book which is all about a family living in the Wye valley in the 21st century; where they visit an archaeological dig site and discover a mysterious bronze mirror. We are currently reading this fabulous book and we will have an opportunity to purchase her books on the same day. (Schoop message to follow). In Literacy, we have been studying the picture book Journey by Aaron Becker. We have been describing the setting using interesting place openers together with adventurous adjectives and verbs. In Numeracy, we have been subtracting numbers by finding the difference, reading numbers up to 100 and beyond, and understanding each numbers value. Thank you for your support.

Wow, what a fantastic first few weeks in Dosbarth 5! We began our topic 'Guess who?' with exploring ourselves and our peers through questioning and creating profiles and wrote a biography about a friend for our first star write of the year. This week we have been focusing on ourselves and have studied types of sentences, nouns and learnt how to infer and deduce information ready to write an autobiography. In maths we have been working on place value and have been using previously learnt knowledge to support us with numbers up to 1,000,000. We enjoyed learning two new country dances in our dance sessions and have been extremely fortunate to welcome members of Newport County on behalf of County in the Community to teach us skills in football as well as supporting us with keeping active. We enjoyed identifying trees, fruits, seeds and leaves in forest school and were extremely fortunate to take part in an archaeological dig right here in the heart of Trellech, where the extremely talented Kate Churchill and Dr Mark Lewis from the National Museum in Cardiff shared some exciting history with us, please ask us about it! We also began reading an autobiography by Baroness Dame Floella Benjamin which describes her journey in 'Coming to England' we look forward to studying Floella's experiences and comparing them with the journey of those that came to Trellech all those years ago and of course our own journeys as we develop and grow together. Year 6 have been incredibly busy with our new topic of "Who do you think you are?". It has been wonderful to see everyone getting to know themselves both mentally and physically. For literacy we have come to the end of our first book "The Barnabus Project" by the Fan Brothers which is a wonderful book about self acceptance and friendship. They have all used extended noun phrases, metaphors and their senses to write adventure stories extending the book and used inference skills to delve into the characters motives. We have researched our family trees, some going back four generations, and investigated the impact of where they have come from geographically on ourselves. Whilst getting to know ourselves better, we have examined the rights we have and then diamond ranked them according to we think are the most important. Year 6 are fortunate to have access to their own courtyard and we are busy trying to revamp it, making it a relaxing space to work and be mindful, whilst also creating a sensory garden. Using their addition skills, all the children have been adding up costings of what they would like to see in it. We have been very fortunate to have been given lots of seeds, pots and even an outdoor light, but if you have anything else that you would be happy to donate then please get in touch. For national coding week, we had a very interesting lesson discussing the ethics and bias of artificial intelligence and training an Ai bot to work for us.
