In Maths, we have been busy learning the days of the week through the story of 'The Hungry Caterpillar.' We then enjoyed creating delicious smoothies using the fruits from the story. We have also been getting to grips with using tens frames to support our addition and subtraction. We have looked at the life cycle of a chicken, completed the happy smells experiment and created a rocket ship to get to space for our Commando Joe's mission. Dosbarth 1

We have had a busy but lovely couple of weeks in Year 1. With Easter approaching we have focussed on exploring the Easter story. As a class the children created actions to retell the story, independently produced story maps which they used to create their own version of the Easter story. In expressive arts Easter continued as children made stained glass windows and Easter cards using tissue paper linking the joy of Easter and symbolic representation. In literacy this week pupil voice was expressed as we explored 'Rabbits' and the children produced individual fact files about rabbits, selecting headings and subheadings. We were so impressed! In maths, new growth inspired us to learn about height, using non-standard units of measurement and a variety of resources practically, we culminated our own height chart. The children loved measuring their friends and comparing their heights. In Welsh we focussed on the weather and likes and dislikes. We extend our thanks to County and the Community for their final, exciting session with the children, the children really enjoyed the sessions and learnt many skills. Dosbarth 2

Well, what a very busy half term this has been! First of all, I want to say a huge thank you to the Year Two pupils for their really confident performance in our Easter celebration. It was great to see them speak and sing clearly and with expression. The pupils have enjoyed World Book Day and Red Nose Day; dressing up and taking part in exciting activities such as artwork and collaborative Lego building. In literacy the pupils have been learning about non chronological features and written them about farming or a chosen farm animal. We have been improving our Welsh reading and comprehension skills with the text 'Yn Y Siop'. In Numeracy we have been analysing and imputing data with Venn and Carroll diagrams. Ibn science, we have been making predictions and recording observations in the tables we have worked hard on to create. A big thank you to Corey and Alex from County in the community who have helped the year two children with awareness, speed, response times and team building skills through a range of fun activities. Dosbarth 3

Once again, I am amazed how much we have managed to squeeze into a short half term! We are all so proud of the children's performance during our Easter play, as I'm sure you are, and they thoroughly enjoyed performing for you. Thank you for all your hard work in helping them to learn their lines, and to practise delivering them confidently and with expression. We also enjoyed taking part in lots of collaborative activities for World Book Day – problem solving, designing a new book and sharing our favourite stories – and Comic Relief, where we designed Lego habitats for different creatures. We were lucky enough to be joined by Technocamps last week, who helped us to build and program our own Lego robots - we've got the coding bug, and look forward to doing more of this in class! In Literacy, the children have begun to create a fact file for a creature of their choice. It has been fascinating to hear all of the facts they are finding, and I am really excited to read their finished work. In Maths we have been learning to tell the time on both analogue and digital clocks. We started by practising o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to, before moving on to reading and showing 5-minute intervals. Linked to our topic, we have been finding out more about how living things depend on each other to survive. We learnt about producers, consumers and decomposers, and explored how different creatures are connected in food chains. We have also been learning new vocabulary in Welsh to classify and describe animals – I have been so impressed! I hope you all have a lovely Easter break, and that the spring sunshine makes an appearance.



Dosbarth 4

Well, where have the last few weeks gone. The Spring term is always busy with Eisteddfod, Comic Relief, World Book Day, Mother's Day, Easter and Science Week. When we come back after half term, we will continue for a few weeks to complete our topic work before commencing a new exciting topic. Last week we completed our letter writing to the Senedd about our concerns for the pollution in our rivers. There has been a bit of a shake up in the Welsh cabinet, so we are not sure if we will have a new member for climate change. We shall have to wait and see. This week we have been identifying the language and text features of a report and then we created our own version of what we think a Snozzwanger could look like together with creating an animation. We had a visit from Technocamps, where the children attended a workshop on how to make Lego Robots, which was really exciting. In Commando Joe's we invented a new game together with a set of rules that could be considered as a new sport. This week we looked at improvising the game so that a disabled person could participate. The children's creativity, together with enthusiasm never ceases to amaze us. Next term we will be starting an International Languages project- involving other year 4 classes from across the cluster with the help of staff from Monmouth Comprehensive. The project will involve us learning Spanish and will finish with us performing 'Los Trez Cerditos,' in July at Monmouth Comprehensive, as well as watching performances from other schools of 'Petit Chaperon Rouge' and 'Aschenputtel.' It's a great project to be involved in and we very much look forward to starting this after Easter. Keep your eye on X (Twitter) for updates! Dosbarth 5 Another busy fortnight in Dosbarth 5 to end another short half term, we began the week with practicing marking our partners in netball and putting together our gymnastics routines in pairs and small groups in the hall. In literacy we wrote a report on threats to plant health including environmental conditions, parasites and disease. We have then shown Sur understanding of pollination planning and recording podcasts explaining the process. In maths we recorded and represented data in tables and worked hard to read and write timetables. We learnt about and made nets of 3D shape, created models and completed activities on perimeter of rectangular and rectilinear shapes. We enjoyed a visit from Technocamps, who supported us with setting up and beginning to explore microbits. We made the microbits light up with symbols, created simple games including rock paper scissors and began to explore ourselves during 'tinker time'. Some of the children helped Mrs Cornish in the garden to plant and pot up plants to sell at the PTA Easter event today, they also planted a shrub in our scented garden. Some of the children dug a hole to keep the fruits trees warm over the weekend and were supported by Dosbarth Derbyn (R). The children enjoyed their Commando Joes mission where they used teamwork to drop the mail using the parachute. 'Home is not a place, it's a feeling.' They also spent some time with Dosbarth Derbyn (R) on red nose day, where they made animal habitats in small groups using Lego. The children enjoyed working together. In Science they have been investigating seed dispersal and written an investigation, completed the investigation and evaluated the investigation. They have then began tracking the soil moisture of plants and following a code using the micro-bits to complete an investigation. In Italian they have learnt the days of the week, months of the year and are beginning to learn the parts of the body. In Welsh they have been learning the parts of the body and have started designing and describing monsters. In ICT they have been working on data and information, using databases to form and record information. Using questions to sort data into groups. Dosbarth 6 Wow! Here we are at the end of the spring term and year 6 have had some fantastic experiences such as World Book Day, Comic Relief and British Science Week. Our literacy has seen the children researching and writing their own travel blog on the Galapagos Islands, using google sites to make their own website. They look so professional, and the all the children worked hard to maintain their writer's voice, use an informal tone and embed images and links. To add to our technical skills, we were very lucky to have a visit from Technocamps who showed us how to programme microbits. The children loved this session and are already looking forward to using the microbits we have in school after easter. Our forest school session even had an ICT theme this week, as the children wrote and debugged algorithms for shapes they made using sticks. For science week, the children designed their own experiments to investigate how animals have adapted to their habitats. In numeracy, we have honed our skills on division in order to calculate the mean average and used four and six figure grid references to track the journey of Darwin's shit "The Beagle". Year 6 loved collaborating with year 2 and 2 to create lego habitats for Comic Relief and created a class book about themselves during World Book Day. To celebrate Easter, we were invited to join all the local churches in Monmouth for the Easter Experience. The children visited various churches where a section of the Easter story was acted out. This prompted much discussion and lots of reflection when we returned to school - many thanks to all those involved. Many of our children attended a netball competition this week, you all played wonderfully and were a credit to the school. Many thanks to all those parents who were able to make it to the talk about our upcoming residential.
