Many of you may have noticed that over the Summer Break we had a new entrance gate installed on main entrance. The works will be completed in next couple of weeks and following this visitors to site will need to use the buzzer system to gain access to the school during the school day. The gate can then be released by a staff member in the school office. Between the hours of 8.45- 9.15am and 3.15- 3.45pm the gate will be released and remain for the arrival and collection of pupils at the start and end of the school day. School Uniform

Class News

Reception:

It has been lovely to meet our new Reception children this week. They have all settled extremely well and have been exploring their new environment. Miss Ward and I have had a lovely week getting to know the children and seeing their bubbly personalities. We have had a tour of the whole school and even got to see some of our siblings in other classes. Over the coming weeks we will be completing a baseline of activities, which will enable us to have a better understanding of your child's individual needs. Our RWI phonics program will commence in the next few weeks. I will send out some additional information on how you can further support your child. Forest school will be every Friday in Reception and therefore your child will need to wear their forest clothes to school for this particular day.

(Waterproof coat, Waterproof trousers, joggers/leggings and a long sleeved top). Please can wellies and P.E kit be brought in as soon as possible, these will remain in school. Forest school will begin on the 7th October and will continue throughout the year. As the colder weather approaches us, please ensure that your child has a hat and pair of gloves. Thank you. I would like you to know that I have an open day policy and therefore if you have any question, worries or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Year One:

It has been a pleasure to welcome a new Year 1 class this week, and after a well-deserved holiday the children have settled in to their new classroom wonderfully. We have made a class pinky promise to help keep our class family happy, safe and healthy, and children came up with fantastic suggestions as to how we can do this. We have been creating beautiful artwork with tissue paper and water as a background for a self-portrait, as well as practising our ICT skills by logging onto the Chromebooks with our usernames and passwords. Year Three:

We have started work on our new topic of Take One Picture, using the painting "A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas" by Claude Joseph Vernet. We have looked closely at the painting and thought of interesting and exciting vocabulary to describe it, and have talked lots about what is happening in the picture. In Maths we have been recapping our knowledge of place value, beginning to look at 4-digit numbers, and have been playing some Maths games to consolidate our times tables.

Year Four:

Welcome to Year 4 and another stage of your child's learning journey. We have had a busy week settling into a new classroom. We have created some paintings for Usk Show and written a poem which will be judged on their hand-writing. These are just a few pointers to help you organise the weeks ahead. Our topic this term is Take one Picture. The whole school is doing the same topic which is quite exciting. The picture in question is a Shipwreck in Stormy Seas by Claude-Joseph Vernet 1773. It will be interesting to see how the children interpret this picture and create lots of learning opportunities. We will let you know how we get on. Please can you ensure that your child's reading book is brought in each day. Please feel free to make a comment in their reading diary after you have listened to them read.

P.E will be a Wednesday and a Friday. So, your child can wear their kit in on those days.

Forest School will commence on Wednesday 21st September, (Same day as P:E). On this day your child can wear their joggers and sweatshirt to Forest school as well as P:E.

Please can you supply your child with some labelled wellies that can be kept in school, as we will be doing lots of outdoor learning in all weathers. Year Five:

It's great to welcome back the children this week in Year 5 and we have had an amazing start to the new term. We've had a busy week already learning about our new topic - Take One Picture; A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas by Claude-Joseph Vernet. We are very excited about our new book William Shakespeare's, The Tempest and can't wait to find out what happens in the story. In maths we have been revisiting place value and working with some very large numbers. We all enjoyed completing the riddle challenges and I can see I have a class of fantastic mathematicians! In Expressive Arts we listened to a synopsis of the painting and responded by creating our own version of the A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas which was great fun. It was Team Building Activities in PE this week where we had to work together to win house points for our team. What a brilliant start we have had to the new term, keep it up Year 5!

Year Six:

It is wonderful to see all of our new Year 6 back to start the year with such enthusiasm and smiles. We have had a fabulous start to the year with everyone so focussed and ready to learn. We have begun our new topic of Take One Picture" based on the painting "A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas" by Claude Joseph Vernet and our novel of The Tempest by William Shakespeare. This has included creating freeze frames of the story so far and character studies.
